




Total Crimes Reported

2015 Line on Crime


- **Fridley:** highest number of stolen autos in Anoka County in 2015 (57), versus 41 in 2014




ATTF GRANT CYCLE JULY 1, 2015—CURRENT

THE PROBLEM:

Accidental Childhood Injury

Accidental injury is the number one cause of death in Minnesota for children ages 1 – 14. According to the Minnesota Department of Health, each year about 350,000 children nationwide under 15 go to hospital emergency rooms for bike related injuries. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of accidental death for children. These children do not get the chance to grow up and become all they can be.

WHAT WE DO:

There is no one device or solution to effectively prevent all types of accidental childhood injuries. Instead, SAFE KIDS combines several factors to create programs that reduce injuries:

- Educating adults and children
- Creating safe environments
- Conducting research
- Advocating for effective laws

THE SOLUTION:

Safe Kids

Safe Kids Anoka County is one of more than 300 grassroots coalitions in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico that bring together health and safety experts, educators, corporations, foundations, governments and volunteers to educate and protect families. Safe Kids Anoka County is a member of Safe Kids Worldwide, a global network of organizations dedicated to preventing accidental injury.

We know our efforts are needed because as many as 90% of accidental injuries can be prevented. Our goal at Safe Kids Anoka County is to provide educational services to children and families which in return will reduce injury rates to our children.





Safety Camp

- Every June, children entering the 3rd or 4th grade in the upcoming school year, have the opportunity to participate in Fridley's annual Safety Camp.
- Safety Camp, which was first held in June, 1995, is a two day event sponsored by the Fridley Police, Fire, and Recreation Departments.
- The main goal of Safety Camp is to help reduce the number of accidents and injuries among our young children. The camp also gives the kids the skills necessary to cope with emergency situations.
- The children are taught safety in the following areas; water, fire, drugs, personal safety, first aid, electricity, gun awareness, railroads, seat belts, campgrounds, burns, and more. The instructors are from State and City Departments and also Regional Organizations.



Car Seat Clinics

- Did you know it's estimated that 4 out of 5 car seats are installed incorrectly?
- It is the law to have your child in a child safety seat until the age of four. In addition, a new law went into effect July 1, 2009 requiring a child who is BOTH under age 8 and shorter than four feet 9 inches to be fastened in a child safety seat that meets federal safety standards. It is recommended to keep a child in a booster seat based on their height rather than their age.

- Involved with the community in some way, such as youth involvement, neighborhood watch, and neighborhood groups.
- Must be 18 years of age or older with no prior felony convictions.

Note: All applicants are subject to a criminal background check.






Fridley Police Reserve Unit

- people from the City of Fridley and surrounding areas who desire to make their community a better place to live, work and play.
- on average donate over 5,000 hours annually to the City of Fridley.

What is a Reserve Officer?

- main role is to support the sworn patrol officers in the field.
- a non-licensed position, with NO arrest powers.
- issued a police uniform, and carries a full duty-belt minus the firearm.
- drives a marked patrol car complete with police radio, red flashing lights and computer.
- allowed to ride-along with licensed, uniformed Fridley Police officers.

Primary Functions of a Reserve Officer

- Patrol Fridley in a marked police car including all public streets, parks, highways and interstate.
- Be another set of eyes to spot criminal activity and report it to the licensed officers.
- Transport prisoners to jail, juvenile detention or detox.
- Perform house and business checks looking for open/unsecured doors.
- Patrol identified problem areas.
- Provide traffic control at accidents or city functions.
- Provide security at city functions.
- Assist disabled motorist in need of aid.


Requirements of a Reserve Officer

- Attend monthly meetings.
- Volunteer 8 additional hours a month to help with special functions, transport duty or city patrol.
- Must have a clean criminal and driving history, confirmed by a background check.
- Must be at least 20 years old and living/working in Fridley.
- Must complete a 10-week (one night-a-week) training academy offered for all Reserve Officers in Anoka County.
- No previous law enforcement experience is necessary, nor do reserves need to be law enforcement students.
