



SPRINGBROOK NATURE CENTER

Springbrook Nature Center, a City of Fridley Park, features three miles of hiking trails through beautiful forests, prairies, an oak savannah, and wetlands. The interpretive center is home to interactive exhibits and a variety of native snakes, turtles and amphibians. Throughout the year, Springbrook Nature Center offers special events, school programs, birthday parties and educational opportunities for visitors of all ages.



BANFILL-LOCKE CENTER FOR THE ARTS

A non-profit community art center located in a historic former tavern and farm house, Banfill-Locke is on the Mississippi River in Fridley at 6666 East River Rd., just off the MRT trail. Erected in 1847, the building functioned as the John Banfill Wayside Inn—a stop for soldiers and fur traders. Within a few years the building was expanded to include a post office and general store. In 1912, the Locke family purchased the property for use as a dairy farm and eventually, summer home.

Converted later into an art center, the Banfill-Locke Center of the Arts provides inspiration, enrichment and education through the arts. BLCA supports and encourages the work of developing and established artists and provides resources and opportunities in the arts for individuals of all ages, backgrounds, and skill levels.



ISLANDS OF PEACE

The Park is located west on Charles Street NE off of East River Road behind several apartment complexes. Islands of Peace is part of the Anoka County Riverfront Regional Park and offers two miles of paved trails for hiking and biking. The wide walking bridge leads from the shoreline to Chase Island but the other two islands -- Dunham and Gil Hodges -- are accessible only by water. Benches, tables, and a picnic shelter are available.



RIEDEL FARM ESTATE

Enjoy the simple elegance of this restored estate for meetings, receptions, or celebrations. The estate offers a seating room, fireplace room, dining room, kitchen, three-season porch, and a large gazebo.

Built in the 1880's, this former home of dairy farmer Albin E. Riedel now serves as a renovated special event facility. The 140 acre Riverfront Regional Park surrounding the property features biking and walking trails, picnicking, a boat launch, and plenty of open play areas.

MOORE LAKE PARK


The park has five open-air picnic shelters which have tables, grills and garbage/recycling receptacles. Outdoor restroom facilities are also located throughout the park. Other amenities include play equipment, tennis and basketball courts, sand volleyball courts, and two fishing piers. The beach is open mid-June through mid-August, with outdoor shower facilities and indoor restrooms available during the swimming season.
