Recodification

What

- Complete review and update of the Fridley City Code
- Authorized by State law and the City Charter

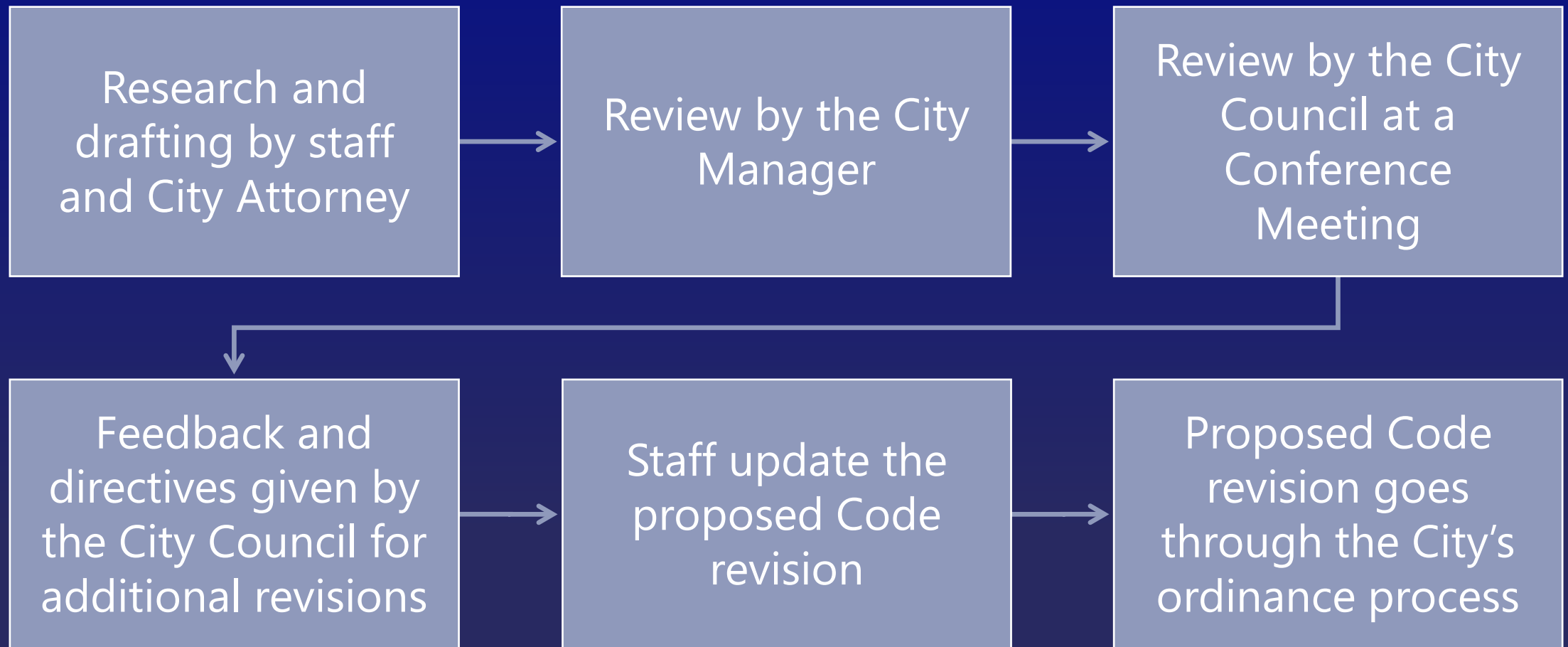
Why

- Accessibility: make the Code easy to access and navigate
- Modernization: align with best practices
- Clarity: make the Code easy to understand

Process



Title No. 3: Health, Safety and Welfare

- Animal Control
- Boats and Watercraft
- Civil Defense
- Curfew
- Dangerous Weapons
- Disposition
- Drugs, Paraphernalia, and Prohibited Substances
- False Alarms
- Fire Prevention
- Liquor Consumption Use or Display
- Sexually Oriented Businesses
- Snowmobile Regulations
- Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling Collection
- Trespassing

Chapter 300, Animal Control

Of note:

- Prohibits all wildlife feeding
 - Except for small birdfeeders
- Poultry license requirements
 - Required coop size from 60 square feet to 120 square feet
- Beekeeping license requirements
 - Remove neighboring property notification and objection
 - Colony must be kept 30 feet away from any neighboring property structures
- Potentially Dangerous Dogs and Dangerous Dogs

Chapter 301, False Alarms

Of note:

- Penalty of \$150 for a third false alarm within 365 days with a \$25 escalator each time after three:
 - Third false alarm: \$150
 - Fourth false alarm: \$175
 - Fifth false alarm: \$200
- Applies to commercial properties only.

Police-related chapters

Chapter 302, Dangerous Weapons and Facsimile Firearms

- Updated definitions for facsimile firearms

Chapter 303, Emergency Management

- Formally creates the City's Emergency Management Organization
- Procedures for responding to a local emergency

Chapter 304, Disposal of Certain Property

- Auction service providers

Police-related chapters, cont.

Chapter 306, Curfew

Chapter 307, Trespassing

- Allows for verbal trespass notice by Public Safety officials

Chapter 308, Adult Entertainment Establishments

- Adopts all of Minnesota Statute Chapter 617

Chapter 309, Liquor Consumption Use or Display

Chapter 305, Drugs, Paraphernalia, and Prohibited Substances

Of note:

- A new chapter to the Code.
- Combination of repealed chapters found in the ordinance.
- Aligns with State law.

Chapter 316, Fire Prevention

Of note:

- Updated definitions
- Adoption of certain portions of the Minnesota State Fire Code
- Inspection of commercial and rental properties
- Re-inspection fees
- Service charge fees

Chapter 317, Boats and Watercraft Chapter 318, Snowmobile Regulations

Chapter 317, Boats and Watercraft

- Paddleboards and kayaks allowed

Chapter 318, Snowmobile Regulations

- Added purpose statement

Chapter 319, Solid Waste Management

Of note:

- Commercial and multi-family regulations
 - Screening
 - Labeling of containers
 - Standards for accessibility to containers.
- Hauler regulations
 - Remove containers after service is cancelled.
- Limit to Residential Mixed Municipal Solid Waste licenses
 - Limited to three licensed haulers, unless the hauler is already licensed
 - Recommended by the Environmental Quality and Energy Commission.

Recommended for repeal

- Air Quality
- Barbiturate Drugs
- Codeine Drugs
- Drugs and Paraphernalia
- Glues and Related Substances
- Fire Department Service Charges
- Public Safety Department
- Public Sanitation Facilities

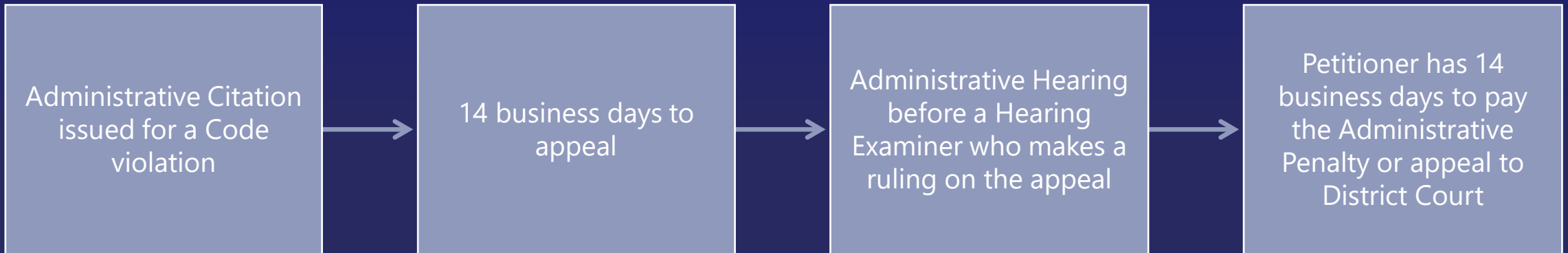

- Appeal processes consolidated and simplified



Next steps

Title	Timeline
March 27	City Council conducts public hearing and first reading of Title No. 3
April 10	City Council conducts a second reading and adoption of Title No. 3
April 13	City publishes a summary of Ordinance No. 1406 in the Official Publication
April 28	Title No. 3 becomes effective
