### 2022 Elections Information

In 2022, there will be two election days for Fridley voters:

- August 9, 2022- Regular Primary
- November 8, 2022- General Election

#### **Early Voting**

If voters are unable to vote on election day, they may want to vote by Absentee Ballot. Fridley residents are welcome to vote early at the Fridley Civic Campus (7071 University Avenue) beginning June 24 for the Regular Primary. Voting hours are Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., and on Saturday, August 6, 2022, from 10 a.m. - 3 p.m. Voters may also vote at the Anoka County Courthouse (2100 3rd Avenue, Anoka, MN 55303).

In addition, voters may request ballots be mailed to their home. To apply for a mailed Absentee Ballot, visit the Minnesota Secretary of State's web site: www.sos.state.mn.us, or call 1-877-600-VOTE (8683).

#### **Local Candidates**

For Fridley City Council, the following vacancies will be on the ballot: Councilmember for Wards 1, 2, and 3. Terms for these Council positions are four years beginning January 1, 2023, and ending December 31, 2026.

#### Redistricting

Since 2020 was a census year, the City of Fridley has undergone redistricting since the last election with the new census information. There were no changes to the wards, however there were some slight changes to two precincts. The reorganization of Ward 2 Precinct 2 and Ward 3 Precinct 3 have caused changes in polling locations. The polling locations at Fridley Covenant Church and Michael Servetus Unitarian Church have closed. The new polling locations for residents who voted at these locations previously are now Hayes Elementary School (615 Mississippi St NE), North Park Elementary School (5575 Fillmore St NE), Redeemer Lutheran Church (61 Mississippi St NE), St. Philip's Lutheran Church (6180 MN-65), and Stevenson Elementary School (6080 E River Rd).

### Your Opinions are Needed!


Concerned about safety issues within the MN 47 and MN 65 corridors? Then let your voice be heard!

Residents, businesses and anyone else interested is invited to share ideas on improving the vital transportation routes we use every day. Do not miss this opportunity to join your friends, neighbors and coworkers to help shape local infrastructure.

The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) is working to develop a future vision for University Avenue (Highway 47) and Central Avenue (Highway 65) from Northeast Minneapolis to the Northtown Mall. The study area passes through the cities of Blaine, Coon Rapids, Columbia Heights, Fridley, Hilltop and Minneapolis – a total of 20 corridor miles.

To gain local input, MnDOT is hosting eight community conversations – four in-person and four online – about existing conditions and how they can be improved. Possible enhancements regarding the future of our intersections and roadways will be shared to gain feedback and ideas. This is an opportunity to express your viewpoints and help improve the future of your community.

## Reminder: Sales and Repair of Vehicles

Pursuant to the Fridley City Code, repair or painting of motor vehicles and small engines is not permitted either as a business or a hobby in the City of Fridley. Minor repairs are allowed if completed within one day.

Vehicle dealers cannot buy, sell or store vehicles on residential property in the City of Fridley.

### **Recodification Update**

A complete review and update of the Fridley City Code is underway. The recodification process involves the Fridley City Council, the City Attorney, and a wide array of staff who work collaboratively to suggest updates to the Code for the public and Council to consider. The process will include a thorough inventory of the Code, and an analysis of every chapter to ensure compliance and alignment with the Fridley City Charter, state statutes, federal laws and various best practices.

The Code is a collection of ordinances, or local laws, adopted by the Council and arranged into a common structure. Coupled with the Charter, it provides the foundation for nearly all municipal functions. It governs numerous procedures of the City, and many behaviors of residents and business owners.


On August 23, 2021, the Council authorized the City Manager to begin recodification. The project is led by the City Manager's Office and facilitated by the City Clerk's Office. At its January 24, 2022, meeting the Council heard an update from staff on Title 1 of the Code

(General Provisions). At its meetings in February, the Council conducted a public hearing and two considerations of the ordinance to update Title 1. The Title was approved on March 14, 2022. The Council will hear an update to a portion of Title 2 (Administration), which outlines administration procedures for City services. The Council will call for a public hearing sometime this summer to review Title 2 and take public comment.

After Title 2 is approved, the City will begin work on Title 3 (Health, Safety, and Welfare), which includes an array of chapters aimed at protecting the health and safety of residents and business owners.

### Recycle Smart - Bulky Plastics are Not Recyclable


It may be tempting to put that broken hamper in your curbside cart or bring your kid's old toy to a recycling center...it is plastic, so it is recyclable, right? Actually, that is NOT correct. Curbside programs are set up to sort plastic bottles, cups and containers by shape and size. Large, bulky, plastic items like children's toys, kiddie pools, lawn furniture, laundry hampers, plant pots, buckets and other plastic household items are not meant for curbside recycling

programs. Drop-off centers do not want them either. They ARE NOT recyclable.


If not damaged, consider reusing or donating these items. If damaged, contact your hauler before throwing away for more details and to see if there is a charge for disposal.


The Citywide Garage Sale will be postponed or canceled if there is inclement or severe weather. Garage sale hosts will be contacted if this situation occurs.

#### Why should I participate?

Funding for this rebate program is provided by the Metropolitan Council's Water Efficiency Grant program to encourage water savings in Fridley. All of the City's water comes from groundwater sources, which take many years to recharge, so it is important that we conserve our water. Pumping from the ground also uses considerable energy, which costs money and contributes to greenhouse gases. Many homes in Fridley have older appliances. Switching to newer, more efficient appliances will save you and the City money and help conserve resources.

#### Who qualifies for the rebate?

All property owners in the City of Fridley qualify. Renters are encouraged to work with the property owner to participate. Rebates for toilets, dishwashers and washing machines can only be used for replacement items, not for new construction. The product must have been purchased after July 1, 2022.

### Why should I update my irrigation system?

Irrigation systems can use a lot of water, especially if they are not properly calibrated. A

smart irrigation controller automatically adjusts watering frequency and amounts based on weather and site conditions. This keeps your yard from getting over-watered. Even if you already have soil sensors, a smart irrigation controller is important, especially in yards with slopes or patches of shade. If every home in the U.S. with an irrigation system used a smart irrigation controller, we could save 100 billion gallons of water per year (equal to the household water needs of 1.2 million Americans). Smart irrigation controllers also allow you to control your irrigation system from your phone and chart water usage over time.

### What are the benefits of rain barrels?

Rain barrels allow you to water your plants using runoff from the roof. This keeps the runoff out of the storm sewer system and promotes storm water infiltration. Rain barrels are a preferable alternative to using irrigation systems, since irrigation systems use drinking water which costs money to pump, treat and distribute.

#### How will I get my rebate?

Your rebate will be applied to your utility bill. Depending on when you submit your receipts, it may take a full billing cycle for your rebate to process. If your rebate is more than your water bill, the rest of the rebate will be applied to the second billing cycle.

### What other rebate programs does the City offer?

### SafeCam -Register Your Surveillance Camera

#### **About SafeCam**

Do you have a surveillance camera at your residence or business? If so, Fridley Public Safety would like to partner with you to help keep your neighborhood safe.

Security cameras can be a great tool when solving crimes, but police are not always aware who has surveillance cameras and potentially vital information to help solve a crime.

The Fridley Public Safety Department is asking residents and businesses to voluntarily register their private video surveillance systems with the department and allow officers to contact them should a crime occur in or near where the camera is installed.

#### Register

#### **FAQs**

#### What is the SafeCam program?

The SafeCam program was launched in the Spring of 2022 by the Fridley Public Safety Department. It is a 100 percent voluntary, optin initiative that allows residents and businesses to register the location of their private video surveillance systems with the department. This allows officers to contact them should a crime occur in or near where the camera is installed. Opting in to the SafeCam program does not give Fridley Public Safety access to video footage until granted by the home or business owner. Interested property owners can register at FridleyMN.gov/SafeCam.

#### Why does Fridley Public Safety need access to private video footage?

When a crime occurs, video footage is one of the most valuable tools available to investigators and officers. Knowing the location of video surveillance systems allows officers to quickly reach out to those owners and ask for their footage, instead of trying to track down where video footage exists, if at all.

#### Do other cities have programs like this?

Yes. Fridley is one of several cities in Minnesota and the country that have similar programs, called SafeCam or otherwise.

#### What kind of cameras could be registered?

Any kind of video surveillance cameras are important. Some common types include video doorbells, wireless video camera systems and home security systems. Registering for the SafeCam program only records the addresses and basic characteristics of the cameras, not the brand or serial number of the cameras.

#### **Does the Police Department have direct** access to my video footage?

No. Registering for the SafeCam program only adds an address to the Public Safety Department's database and map of camera locations throughout Fridley. If a crime occurs in the area video footage is needed, the Public Safety Department will reach out directly to the owner to request the footage.

#### Can I opt out?

Yes. Once registered for the SafeCam program, you may opt out of the program at any time by calling the Public Safety Department at 763-572-3629.

### Home Alone Safety Tips for Kids

- Post emergency phone numbers where children can see them. Include 9-1-1, the parents' work and cell numbers, numbers for neighbors, and anyone else who is nearby and trusted.
- Have and practice a fire evacuation plan. Make sure that all of the smoke detectors work. Review emergency exits and discuss pathways to safety from each room in the house. In the event of a fire, children should 1) get out of the house immediately, then 2) call 911 from a neighbor's house or cell phone.
- 3. Schedule check-ins. Make it a rule that your child calls a parent (or other adult that you designate), or leaves you a message at designated times throughout the day and if they leave/return home.
- Your child should not leave the house unless it has been cleared with you first or there is an emergency such as a fire.
- Remove or safely store ammunition and weapons in locked areas.
- Have a first aid kit handy and review it with your
- Lock the doors and if the home has an electronic security system, children should learn how to turn it on and have it on when home alone.
- Never open the door to strangers. Always check before opening the door to anyone by looking out through a peephole or window.
- Kids should not talk about being home alone on social media.
- 10. Keep them busy. Kids are less likely to get into trouble if they are occupied with homework, chores and other activities.
