While dealing with the pandemic, we also had to start handling civil unrest in Fridley and Minneapolis. Our new Emergency Operations Center was activated and used as a main hub for all of Anoka County to coordinate efforts to maintain law and order.

Tragedy struck on September 13, 2020, when our Deputy Director/Fire Chief, Mike Spencer, unexpectedly passed away at his home. Mike was incredibly dedicated to the fire service and to the Fridley community. He will truly be missed. Though we continue to mourn his loss, his memory will live on for years to come.

I strongly believe that you see the true character of a person during tough times. Throughout the year of 2020, we were able to see the incredible resolve of our public safety staff. They were always positive and calm throughout the difficult times. Many stepped up when needed and throughout the whole year we could see our

police and fire staff grow closer as we served the community. Even with all of the events from this year, our police and fire staff were able to conduct inspections, keep-up on their training and participate in community events. They are a truly amazing group of people and I am proud of their work in an unprecedented year.

Our department theme in 2021 will be "Keeping our Community Support, One Call at a Time." We appreciate the support and cooperation of our community. The Public Safety staff is dedicated to providing quality service to the City of Fridley.

It is an honor and a privilege to serve as Director of Public Safety to the City of Fridley, and I look forward to a great 2021.


Use of Force Incidents: 163


Use of Force Occurrence Rate: .005% of all Calls for Service


Taser Deployed in .067% of all Use of Force Incidents


Use of Force by Race






# Arrestee City of Residence






### Fire Calls for Service by Type

## Community Programs











Courtney Miller, Crime Prevention Specialist, oversees the police department's crime prevention program. Crime Prevention includes overseeing nearly 200 Neighborhood Watch Block Captains. A block captain is a Fridley resident who acts as the communication link between residents and the police department. Night to Unite is the annual event celebrating this partnership. Crime prevention also includes community outreach like Shop with a Cop and Coats from Cops, as well as community education like Safety Camp and Heart Safe training. Courtney also reviews crime reports to develop crime alerts to inform the community and conducts analysis to understand crime trends.



# Fridley Fire and Fridley Public Schools Partner to Provide Families with Smoke Detector Batteries

With the increase in distance learning, teachers at Fridley Public Schools noticed something while engaging with students thought online learning. During video class sessions several teachers could hear a persistant electronic chirping sound in the background while teaching students. It was the sound of smoke detectors that needed new batteries. After meeting with several teachers, Pat Varro, School Psychologist at Hayes Elementary, identified that this was a problem that affected several families. Pat contacted Fire Marshal James Lange at Fridley Fire Division and they were able to take advantage of a battery program sponsored by Energizer. Now the district can provide batteries for students to help keep their families safe this winter.






## Baby Supply Giveaway Event


## In Memory of Mike Spencer



On September 13, 2020, Deputy Director of Public Safety/Fire Chief, Mike Spencer, passed away unexpectedly. Chief Spencer served the City of Fridley beginning on October 1, 2006, as a paidon-call firefighter. He was promoted to Captain in January of 2015, and Fire Marshal the following November. Spencer was promoted to Fire Chief/ Deputy Public Safety Director in June of 2019. Prior to his time in the Fridley fire service, Spencer served in the United States Navy. Mike dedicated his life to serving others, particularly a community he loved and called home. In 2017, Spencer was recognized for aiding a victim whose home was lost in a fire. Spencer found shelter for the displaced resident, coordinated cleaning of the home and located resources. Mike truly cared for the community he served. He

was genuine and kind. Though he is sorely missed, his legacy will live on in those he trained, following in his footsteps to serve the Fridley community.


