# Highway 47 (University Ave.) and Highway 65 (Central Ave.) Study

Blaine, Columbia Heights, Coon Rapids, Fridley, Hilltop, Spring Lake Park and Northeast Minneapolis

## Two roads, many modes

Hwy 47 (University Ave.) and Hwy 65 (Central Ave.) are important parts of the local and regional transportation system. They connect people, neighborhoods, and businesses from Northeast Minneapolis to Blaine. People travel these roads by walking, rolling, biking, riding transit, and driving. In addition to moving people, these roadways help deliver a variety of goods to and from businesses and distribution sites in the area, and national and international markets.


Along both roadways, there are locations that have higher than average instances of crashes — and crashes that involve pedestrians and bicyclists are far more likely to result in death or severe injuries. So MnDOT is asking communities and users of these two roads what they need to travel more safely and comfortably.

# Study area

The communities along University Ave. and Central Ave. are diverse, both in the people who live and work here, and the ways people use the roadways to move around. By studying these corridors together, MnDOT will better understand the overall transportation needs of the area, and be able to understand the kinds of improvements that make travel safer and more convenient for all users.

# Expected outcome: A shared vision

This study will develop a shared vision for the types of improvements that the communities say—and the data show—are needed most. The study will not design specific construction projects, but will lay the groundwork to seek future funding and environmental approval.
