Knowing that our children had been so affected by all the changes that came with the pandemic (activities canceled, virtual schooling, social isolation, etc.), the Foundation approved a measure that would open up the qualifications for camp scholarships to include families impacted by the pandemic.

Also, with the help of our very gracious donors and a match from the Fridley Lions Club, we were able to help secure the funding to complete the green roof on the nature center. This exciting new feature will provide a multitude

However, different from most non-profit organizations, the City of Fridley owns and operates the Springbrook Nature Center while the Springbrook Nature Center Foundation raises funds for additional programming, capital enhancements and other program support. The above unaudited financial statement does not include personnel and other general operating expenses for Springbrook Nature Center. The Springbrook Nature Center Foundation is in final stages of a major capital fundraising campaign to support the enhanced development of Springbrook Nature Center. Note that during the pandemic, the Springbrook Nature Center Foundation has not been able to run many of its fundraising events.
